Where do you encounter chemistry in your everyday life?

For take-home work, we want you to take pictures showing the ways chemistry impacts you, your family, and/or your community.

Instructions:

- 1. Use your cellphone or a digital camera to take pictures.
- 2. You will get a sheet to fill out about each picture you take. On the sheet there are three examples to help you understand what to do.
- 3. Choose as many things and take as many pictures as you like, but please take **at least five**. All of the pictures you choose should show an aspect of chemistry that is personally interesting to you.
- 4. Please make sure photos are accessible to you in class, either on your device, or emailed to an account you can access. This is very important so that we can debrief the activity together. *

Some things to remember:

- Do NOT include people's faces in the pictures. You can take pictures anywhere you have permission, but please only take pictures in places that allow cameras.
- Be sure to fill out the sheet explaining what pictures you took, where you took them, and how they describe aspects of chemistry that you are interested in exploring further. We have given you three examples so you know how to fill out the sheet.
